

Featured Project: Ross Priory, Loch Lomond



Stone Type: Sandstone

Located at the south end of Loch Lomond, this fine stone building is used extensively by Strathclyde University. Due to years of neglect the external stone fabric of the building was in poor condition, and a major restoration programme was initiated to replace and consolidate the stonework.

Stirling Stone were selected as main contractor. Work included indenting of ashlar walling and other façade dressings, with full replacement of badly eroded stonework to the entrance steps along with the ramp and twist balustrade plus the ornate high level parapet work. Also at roof level, due to the unstable condition, the corner crocketed pinnacles were taken down and rebuilt. As part of our main contract, other sub trades were used including slaters, plumbers, joiners and painters.
